Jewel parent to expand Southport store

The Jewel grocery store at 3630 N. Southport in the Lake View neighborhood will be replaced and upgraded by a combination Jewel-Osco store nearly twice the size of the existing store, according to its owner.

It will open as a two-story structure in the fall of 2008, featuring 130 underground garage parking spaces, and upgraded grocery and drugstore. It will require that Jewel be closed at this location for approximately 10 months. The Osco across the street has been sold to CVS, part of a larger acquisition by CVS of 150 stand-alone Osco stores. Minutes of the Graceland West Community Association General Membership Meeting

A General Membership Meeting took place at Warner Park on Tuesday, June 6, 2006 at 7:00 pm. In attendance were the following Board Members: Jim Friestad, Barbara Sullivan, Jane Huber, Tom Ramsey, Chris Chesne and Carol Blalock, with Board Member Christi Lowell chairing the meeting. Approximately 11 other neighbors were also in attendance.

Approval of the March 2006 Membership Meeting minutes, along with approval of the financial report, was approved by unanimous decision. We have a cash balance of \$9,622.00, with \$571.00 in income and \$995.43 in expenses for the first 5 months of 2006.

Committee Reports were given:

➤ Garage Sale:

Christi Lowell reported that 20 neighbors would be participating this year on Saturday June 10, 2006, beginning at 9:00 am.

➤ GWCA Fest:

Barb Sullivan reported that a planning meeting is scheduled for June 14, 7:30 pm at Ranalli's on Montrose. Discussions will include new sources for the silent auction items, such as neighborhood resident services (snow shoveling, baby sitting etc). GWCA Members will be entitled to a discounted ticket rate and free entry to the evening party. Non-GWCA Members will pay a higher rate for tickets and will have to pay to attend the evening party.

➤ GWCA Dinner Get-Together:

Carol Blalock and Jane Huber reported that the next GWCA dinner get-together has been scheduled for Sunday, July 23 at 6:30 pm at Ranalli's on Montrose. A 3-4-course menu will be offered, for approximately \$30 including tax and tip. Ranalli's is BYOB, and they will provide the group a cooler and table for bar set-up. People can RSVP to Carol or Jane via e-mail or phone.

➤ June Board Elections:

Three terms have expired: those of Carol Blalock, Jim Friestad and Jane Huber. Ann Maxwell has graciously agreed to replace Jane Huber. Terry Baublis' neighbor Jen Kroah will replace Jim Friestad for a 6-month term, and Keith Johnson of Pensacola Avenue has graciously agreed to replace Carol Blalock.

➤ Garden Walk:

After much discussion, and after consideration of cancellation, the 24th annual Garden Walk was held Sunday July 9, 2006, from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm. However, an evening dinner was not held. The Garden Walk Committee is looking for organizers, gardeners and ideas for next year's 25th Annual Walk.

➤ Container Gardening Demonstration:

Monica from Fertile Gardens at Diversey and Paulina provided a demonstration of container gardening for both shade plants and sun plants. She suggests packing peanuts be used as a drainage base at the bottom of the pot and used lobelia, begonias and impatiens in her

shade container, and ornamental millet, daisies, straw flowers and petunias in her sun container. The finished containers were donated to Warner Park.

➤ Neighborhood Beautification:

Tom Ramsey reported on his progress with learning about the possibility of GWCA banners/signs for the neighborhood. He presented a picture of a metal sign that currently hangs in the Lakewood Balmoral neighborhood, and said each one costs \$2,000. Alderman Schuler would require final approval of any artwork, and a maintenance contract would have to be initiated with the city in order to erect the signs/banners. Lakewood/Balmoral said that the process took approximately 1 year and several fundraisers were held to raise the money for the signs. Tom is looking into other options (less costly) as well as ideas to raise money for these.

➤ LVHS Liaison & Happenings:

Ann Bines reported that Steve Bines had been reelected to the LVHS Board, and that the Board is currently on a break for the months of May, June and July. She thanked the neighborhood for the votes and support of Steve's campaign.

➤ GWCA Registration and Directory:

The GWCA Registry needs to be redeveloped, due to the loss of data in the Sullivan/McGonegle fire. Kathy Scardina has provided Barb Sullivan with a list of GWCA members as a starting point.

➤ Confidentiality Policy for Block Captain Contact Information:

Tom Ramsey, along with neighbor Mick Domagala, developed a draft of a GWCA Resident Information Policy, to be used by those "block captains" gathering neighbor information. A few revisions were made, but discussion was tabled for another time. Tom said he is having difficulty finding volunteers to be block captains. A motion was made and passed to reimburse Tom \$85.40, for the cost of his Block Captain kick-off event. Additional volunteers are needed for this effort – recruiting should be done at GWCA Fest and other times as well.

➤ Neighborhood Security:

Chris Chesne reiterated some of the facts that he put forth in the last GWCA newsletter, regarding an increase in crime, speeding, graffiti and loitering in the neighborhood, particularly the south end of GW. Carol Blalock invited people to attend the CAPS meeting with her, scheduled for June 7, 2006 at Chase Park. Janice Horwich provided Carol with a picture of gang graffiti on a building at Ashland and Belle Plaine, mentioned that people are trespassing at the construction site at 4136 N. Greenview, and mentioned that FedEx and USPS packages are being stolen from front stoops. Janice has noticed a large increase in the amount of tagging incidents in the last 6 weeks and commented that this appears to be a more active season than past seasons. Residents are again reminded to call 311 and 911 for ALL related activities.

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 9:15 pm.
