

Lake View High School News

The Principal, Scott Feaman, extended his thanks to GWCA for its continuing support and recent monetary donation. The money will be used to improve the school's main entrance. He will also contact the band instructor, Mr. Jim Barbic, to see if he can locate a volunteer drummer to lead the GWCA Fest pet parade in September.

The Local School Council discussed several issues at its July meeting that impact enrollment.

First, LVHS has been designated a receiving school for Foreman High School located near Belmont and Laramie. LVHS will be expected to enroll 25 to 40 students because Foreman is overcrowded.

Secondly, LVHS has undergone a "facility inspection" to determine its capacity. Current enrollment is 1350 students. Although the results of the inspection are not yet in, the principal is concerned that enrollment could go up to 1600 students.

Thirdly, the Chicago School Board is considering a boundary change for LVHS that would produce an immediate influx of 125 new freshmen.

The principal expressed his concern that the steady gains that LVHS has made in reading and math scores will be eroded by an influx of students because the class sizes will increase and the environment of "small, learning communities" will disappear. Charter schools and selective admissions schools have the privilege of limited enrollment. LVHS has achieved its gains even though 18% of the children they educate have been designated "special need" and many bright children who live in the area chose other educational options.

Beyond the obvious educational issues, there is the issue of 250 more children attending LVHS and how it will impact the neighborhood. The LSC has written to the CPS board, Mr. Arne Duncan and Mr. Eugene Schulter requesting that enrollment remain at 1350. Neighbors who feel strongly about this issue are asked to write letters as well. A vocal neighborhood can influence their decisions.

A General Membership Meeting took place at Warner Park & Gardens on Monday, June 13, 2005 at 7:00 pm. In attendance were the following Board Members: Jim Friestad, Ann Maxwell, Dimitri Christopolous, Tim McGonegle, Bob Flannery, and Carol Blalock. Approximately 22 other neighbors were also in attendance.

PRESENTATION

Alhambra, located at 3737 N. Southport, selling garden furniture and plants and specializing in container gardens, provided the presentation. Alhambra donated 3 beautiful containers, which were raffled off to attendees. Winners were Ellen Romano, Steve Bines and Deirdre Jameson.

The most successful containers have plenty of holes for drainage and are filled all the way to the top with potting soil, so that the plants don't have as far to grow, in order to spill over the sides and look abundant. A lightweight, slow release fertilizer is recommended (Miracle Grow Potting Mix along with Miracle Grow Osmocote) for long life and full blooms. Large focal points in the center of the container are important, along with a mix of foliage and flowering plants. Perennials also work well. Alhambra generally uses 4-1/2" cups for maximum impact.

MEMBERSHIP MEETING: NEW BUSINESS

I. Approval of the March 14, 2005 Membership Meeting minutes was moved and approved, with a request to revise the amount of funds approved for GWCA Fest, from \$7,000 to \$9,000, with an expected \$2,000 in income resulting from the Fest.

II. Committee Reports:

- a. The Garden Walk needs volunteers on Pensacola and Cullom to solicit their neighbors to show their gardens and also need volunteers to create the location signs for the blocks. Contact Dawn Ragan or Donna Forsburg if you're interested in volunteering. Exhibitors will qualify to win a Gesthemanie gift certificate, and are invited to attend the after-Walk dinner party at Warner Park & Gardens. The 23rd Annual Graceland West Garden Walk will be held on Sunday, July 10 from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm.
- b. Seven (7) people attended a GWCA Fest planning meeting last week. The committee is looking for a volunteer to help with publicity and a volunteer to supervise the Boy Scouts with the games portion of the day. GWCA Fest will be held on Saturday, September 10 in the 4300 block of Greenview, from 12:00 to 4:00 pm, with the evening adult party scheduled for 7:00 10:00 at Warner Park & Gardens.
- III. Elections were held to replace three outgoing GWCA Board Members: Tim McGonegle, Dale Petersen and Laura LeCoque. Steve Bines and Barbara Sullivan were elected by acclamation, and GWCA is still looking for one more volunteer.

IV. 4136 N. Greenview:

- a. A recap was provided on what has occurred so far with the lot at 4136 N. Greenview Avenue. The GWCA Board was approached by Ald. Schulter regarding the excavation being in violation of the 45 foot setback. A "Stop Work Order" was issued. A City of Chicago Zoning Administrator was present at the meeting in order to facilitate a compromise on the setback. The Administrator sought to establish a baseline of approximately 35 feet based on surveys taken of other lots in the area. The city does not enforce private convenants.
- b. The Alderman was going to consider a lesser overlay district but not as recorded on the plats. This was found to be unacceptable to nearby neighbors.
- c. A lawsuit was filed in early May to enforce the setback. Judge Bronstein issued a Temporary Restraining Order on May 18,

2005. A preliminary or permanent injunction date has not yet been set. Discovery is taking place now, with a status to be determined in early August.

- d. The defendants responded with a survey of the West side of the 4100 block of North Greenview claiming current placements of stairs, porches & bays are in violation.
- e. The plaintiffs are asking for GWCA to join as a party plaintiff to the suit.

Discussion:

- a. Board members and the association are protected from being sued by the defendants because of the not for profit status of GWCA with the exception of willful and wanton conduct.
- b. Two people voiced concerns about GWCA being a party to the suit and felt it would set a precedent. On what basis would GWCA choose to support future covenant issues?
- c. One neighbor mentioned that all neighbors should send a letter to the Alderman, expressing support for the plaintiffs in the case, in order to exert public pressure.
- d. Several neighbors voiced concerns that violation of the setback would result in a domino effect, i.e. any future teardowns would want to build right up to the sidewalk and violate setbacks in other parts of Graceland West. Current setbacks on side streets are not protected, as they average around 25 feet, and current zoning stipulates 20 feet.
- e. One neighbor stressed that it is incumbent upon the Board to become a party to the suit, if only to enforce its own by-laws, which are "to develop and preserve an appreciation for the historical significance of the area and to encourage preservation, restoration and beautification".

Motions:

- 1. A resolution supporting the plaintiffs will be sent to the Alderman. It was unanimously passed.
- 2. A resolution for all supporting neighbors to petition the alderman, using a "boiler plate" letter to be found on the GWCA web site. It was unanimously approved.
- 3. A resolution for GWCA to formally become a plaintiff in the pending litigation. In order for the resolution to be passed, GWCA needs an extraordinary majority for such a major decision by the membership:

Those in favor:	18	
Those against:	4	
Those abstaining:	6	
The motion was passed.		

- V. GWCA Yard Sale: No yard sale will be held this year. Those interested in heading up a community yard sale for next year should inform a GWCA board member.
- VI. Illinois Transportation Improvement Grant: Joy Schaad asked GWCA to contact Ald. Schulter about applying for a grant for the area on Clark Street from Montrose to Irving Park Road. The funding is 80% federal and 20% local, and is allocated toward new and improved light fixtures, pavement, etc. A motion was passed unanimously to investigate this grant money.
- VII. Lake View High School: Steve Bines discussed the possibility of the City of Chicago directing 400 more students to Lake View High School, and its resulting effects on parking, moving students in and out of the neighborhood, and the possible decline in test scores. He will send a letter to the school board, on behalf of GWCA, opposing the additional students and supporting Principal Scott Feaman and LVHS present enrollment.

The meeting adjourned at 8:50pm

The next general meeting will be held on Thursday, August 25th at 7pm.
