"GRACELESS TALES, an Irregular Column"

Tale #3 By Tom Ramsey

"Why does that Building have TWO Addresses?"

Why does the apartment building in which beloved Andies Restaurant is located have two different addresses? Significantly different addresses at that! On your next walk or drive by the address now known as 4357 N. Greenview Ave., glance carefully at the TWO addresses above the door. In the tympanum window, notice the beautifully crafted stained glass artwork with the other address of 1410 placed there. What is that all about? Unlike some similar street address mysteries that can be explained by a building owner having installed an architectural treasure from elsewhere (perhaps salvaged from a classic building facing destruction) into a custom made niche, such is not the case here as it is in some transom windows above residential doorways in which attractive decorative pieces display the address-signifying item from prior to a renovation. No, not here, not on this building.

Explaining this crazy address mystery requires some recall of City of Chicago...As you know from a past "Graceless Tales" column, the City of Lake View was annexed to the City of Chicago in 1889. Being a separate city, Lake View had its own street numbering system. Post annexation, in what must have been a difficult and confusing arrangement, the addresses in the former Lake View were retained in their original number even though they were now in Chicago. It wasn't until 1909, twenty years later, that the City of Chicago placed all areas of the City on the now familiar Madison-State unified street numbering system.

So, the apartment building entry door just south of Andies was formerly 1410 N. Admiral Perry Blvd.on the old Lake View numbering system. After 1909, that same building received the new address of

4357 N. Greenview.

Due to the passage of time and the prevalence of building destruction and renovations in recent decades, many of the old indications of the former number system have gradually disappeared.

Another instance of the non-coincidental address systems, this one quite visible and with remarkably elegant script writing, is incised into the pair of limestone roundelles at 4621-23 N. Beacon in the nearby Sheridan Park neighborhood. The address indicated in the incising is the old Lake View address of 3216-3218 (again, very different!). About one block from Wrigley Field is yet another example at 855-857 West Addison (old address of 1503-1505 EAST (!) Addison). Here, the incising is on a slant above the semi-circular arching limestone framing the entrance doorway. More about that "East" part next time!

Do YOU know of any other examples of these vestigial addresses? Please share those.



Minutes of the Graceland West Community Association General Membership Meeting

Business: The nomination committee recommended a slate of Carol Blalock, Donna Forsberg and Barbara Sullivan to serve from Jan. 1, 2007 until Jun. 30th, 2008. Outgoing board members are Steve Bines, Debbie Frisch and Barbara Sullivan. Welcome to new (and continuing) board members and many thanks to the two outgoing board members. The new slate was accepted and approved.

Motions were passed to contribute \$750 to Lake View High School and \$750 to Warner Park & Gardens for 2006.

Jan Horwich reiterated that the Lake View High School tutoring program still needs more tutors in the math and science fields.

Budget 2008: The budget for 2008 was accepted with one amendment. A proposal for a GWCA sponsored \$1000 scholarship to a Lakeview High School student who attends a college within the state of Illinois was proposed and accepted. Steve Bines will also speak to Mr. Feaman as to the best use of a \$750 donation to Lakeview High School.

Meeting was adjourned as a delicious potluck was enjoyed!

Alderman Schulter announced that in August 2007 the 47th Ward is one of seven wards scheduled to participate in the "blue cart separate collection recycling" program. It is a joint venture between the State of Illinois and the City of Chicago. The Resource Center, who has been collecting recyclables in Graceland West supports this program and believes it will be effective. Ellyn is working with the Resource Center to prorate annual fees for neighborhood participants who will switch to the city program in August. A Household Hazardous Waste and Computer Recycling Event is scheduled at DeVry University (3401 N. Rockwell) on April 28, 2007. You can also try Household Products and Electronics Collection and Training Center at 1150 N. North Branch Goose Island This service resumes in spring.

Hours: Tues. 7am-noon, Thursdays 2pm-7pm, and the 1st Saturday of each month, from 8am-3pm.

This long-term HHW program is the result of an intergovernmental agreement between the Illinois EPA and the City of Chicago's Dept. of the Environment. The 47th Ward Public Service Office (4237 N. Lincoln Ave.) has a household battery recycling collection container for residents to dispose of old batteries.
