NEW CITY ORDINANCE FOR GREENVIEW

Ordinance SO2006-118 was passed by the City Council of the City of Chicago and deposited in the office of the City Clerk of said City Jan. 11. 2006:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Title 17 of the Municipal Code of the City of Chicago, the Chicago Zoning Ordinance, is hereby amended by creating a new Section 17-7-0550 North Greenview Avenue Special Setback District as follows:

17-7-0551 Purpose

The North Greenview Avenue Setback District is intended to required larger front setbacks for new residential development consistent with the existing pattern of front yards on that portion of North Greenview Ave. as described below.

17-7-0552 Boundaries

The North Greenview Avenue Setback District applies to properties abutting North Greenview Ave. within the following specific subdistricts:

Subdistrict A bounded by: West Berteau Ave.; the alley next east of and parallel to North Greenview Ave.; West Irving Park Road; North Greenview Ave.; West Belle Plaine Ave.; and the alley next west of and parallel to North Greenview Ave.. North Greenview Ave.; a line 276.9 feet north of and parallel to West Berteau Ave.; and the alley next west of and parallel to North Greenview Ave..

Subdistrict C bounded by:

West Cullom Ave.; the alley next east of and parallel to North Greenview Ave.; West Hutchinson Str.; and North Greenview Ave..

Subdistrict D bounded by:

West Hutchinson Str.; a line 190 feet east of and parallel to North Greenview Ave.; the alley next south of and parallel to West Hutchinson Ave.; the alley next east of and parallel to North Greenview Ave.; West Berteau Ave.; and North Greenview Ave.

17-7-0553 Front Setbacks

The minimum front setback in Subdistrict A is 40 ft. The minimum front setback in Subdistrict B is 45 ft. The minimum front setback in Subdistrict A is 30 ft. The minimum front setback in Subdistrict A is 40 ft.

See Sec. 17-17-0306 for rules governing the measurement of front setbacks.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be effective after its passage and publication.
