Crime committed? Call 9-1-1, 3-1-1 and More!

Are you witness to more crime in your area of late? Don't sit back and let it happen! As a community, we need to make sure criminals don't get comfortable in our neighborhood. Crime has a negative effect on our quality of life, our property values, our social lives, our personal security. As individuals, there are several things we can do to stop crime from happening with regularity.

Several people have come forward to report various crimes and disturbances over the past several months, including: gang graffiti on garages, walls and our Warner Park gazebo; stolen property (even a run on several front doorknobs!); speeding through alleys and down streets; excessive noise and traffic impedance from (mostly) students on the street before/during/after school; drug-dealing and consumption; littering and loitering in the street; and other, more sinister crimes and evidence thereof such as threatening action, a bullet casing found in one lawn and a long knife found embedded in another lawn.

Please, when you see a crime committed or even an unlawful disturbance, call the appropriate number: 9-1-1 is for crimes in progress and other emergencies, 3-1-1 is for non-emergency situations. Police cars are regularly in the area; we should receive a quick response. When you call 9-1-1, insist on a written report and ask for a copy.

Officer Frank Dietz is the on-site police officer at Lake View High School. Call 9-1-1 if you see something in progress outside the school. However, if you want to discuss the activity, call Frank at 773-534-5444. You may also e-mail Steven Bines at steven-d-bines@rush.edu with your concerns of Lake View High School student "activity". Steve is our neighborhood liaison to the school and he is quick to point out that LVHS is a wonderful asset, an opportunity for 1400 kids to get a decent education. Perhaps only a small few of these are troubled. Let's not let the actions of a few troubled souls color our vision of the others. We can best help out by reporting unlawful or dangerous activity.

And yet another thing...We live near Wrigley Field. It brings the fans. Sometimes the fans don't pay attention to the quietude and cleanliness we desire. The Chicago Cubs fund a command center and hotline operated by the Chicago Police Department to receive calls from neighborhood residents on days before, during and after home games. That number 1-866-4-CPD-TOW. For community concerns at other times, 773-404-4175.

If we report crime, the police will notice our needs, and more patrol cars will flow through the neighborhood. That can only have a positive effect on our overall wellbeing. Squeaky wheel, eh?

Lakeview High School, Student Management and Report

Submitted by Steve Bines, GWCA Board Member and Local School Council Representative

I have talked to Scott Feaman, the principal at LVHS. He is eager to work with the neighborhood. Here are some facts:

- The campus is closed for freshmen and sophomores. This means they cannot leave school during the day.
- 2) Juniors and seniors in good standing (good attendance, no discipline issues, good grades) are awarded a "Gold Card" that allows them to leave campus for lunch. 400 hundred students have earned the priviledge of a gold card. They eat at Popeye's, Subway and the food joints on Irving Park. There are very few problems reported from these lunch-time excursions.
- There are two Chicago policemen assigned to the school from 9:30 am to 2:30 pm. They work closely with the Principal.
- 4) There are 4 security guards assigned to the school. Their job is school safety and security. Mr. Feaman also has 3-4 school assistants he uses for

- security when the need arises.
- 5) Faculty is assigned to walk the perimeter of the school.
- 6) Occasional checks of Warner Park are being considered.
- 7) Directing the police officers to alleys near the school is a possibility, as well.
- 8) The school welcomes dialogue with the neighbors.

The principal suggests bringing concerns to the LSC via the monthly public LSC meeting (the second Wednesday of the month, 5:30 pm in the social room). He also would gladly arrange a special meeting with concerned neighborhood residents and the police officers and security people assigned to the high school.

Mr Feaman is rightfully proud of the progress LVHS has made. The faculty, students and parents I have met are good people. The actions of a few "knuckle heads" don't represent the true spirit of our neighborhood high school.

What's a "BLOCK CAPTAIN", and how big is their ship?

Two BLOCK CAPTAIN volunteers per block would assist in doing these things.

While the role and responsibilities of the block captains will evolve, at this time, it is envisioned that they will assist with...news dissemination, locating volunteers for GWCA activities, spreading information about local crimes, acting as a liaison to the GWCA Board, helping GWCA Board assess issues block-by-block, etc.

Their terms end June 30, 2006. For the past 18 months or more, each has contributed time, effort, and their own individual perspective to continually improve the neighborhood, and create new, fresh ideas for the future.

Meeting Minutes for the GWCA General Membership Meeting held on 3/7/2006 at Lake View High School

Jane Huber chaired the meeting. It was called to order at 7:15 PM. Steve Bines moved that the minutes for the December GWCA general membership meeting that were published in the newsletter, be approved. Debbie Frisch seconded the motion and the minutes were approved.

New business topics included:

GWCA will arrange a Spring dinner at Anna Maria Pasteria, 3/26. Anyone interested in attending, should contact Carol Blalock or Jane Huber to reserve a spot. Discussion about the possibility of doing a similar dinner at Ranalli's later in the year, as well as organizing a wine tasting in the area ensued.

Christy Lowell provided an overview of the GWCA Neighborhood Garage Sale which will be held Sat. June 10th. Cost for members is \$5, non-members \$10. If you are interested but don't have a suitable location, you can share space with a neighbor. Please register with Christi.

GWCA Board elections will be held at the June General Membership meeting. GWCA members will need to elect 4 new board members. Debbie, Carol, Jim and Jane will be leaving the Board. All those attending were asked to consider running and urge someone on their block to run as well.

The next Board meeting will be held at Debbie Frisch' house on Tues. April 4th. We reviewed the current Board member assignments (see board member listing on page____) and encouraged people to contact these people for information on or suggestions for GWCA.

Community Support - Tom Ramsey discussed lightpole banners for the GWCA neighborhood and potential sidestreet zoning setbacks. The board would like to establish some means of defining and identifying the GWCA neighborhood, either throughout or at the very least on the periphery. Options include banners, signs, flowerplanters, etc. Cost could be deferred by residents and businesses sponsoring individual banners or selling additional banners as a fundraiser. Lincoln Square, Upton and North Center have successful programs. Cost of banners is \$60-100 each.

Re: sidestreet zoning: Some of the sidestreets may want to petition for zoning setbacks for their individual block. Tom will follow up and outline the process for doing so. This would only take place if the majority of residents on the block are in favor. All agreed that we should identify block captains to survey the various sidestreet blocks to determine whether they may want to proceed. If a particular block is interested, Tom will help to facilitate the process. Tom asked that we continue to discuss the possibility at future meetings, Debbie Frisch seconded, all were in favor.

Chris Chesne noted that there has been an increase in the amount of graffitti in the GWCA neighborhood recently including the gazebo at Warner Park. The Board will discuss this in more detail at their next meeting. Chris will draft a letter to the school board and will provide a list of areas where grafitti has been seen in the neighborhood. The GWCA CAPS reps, Debbie and Carol, will bring it up at their next CAPS meetings with specific details, we may also bring it to the attention of the LVHS Board and cc: the Alderman re: this issue. CAPS 1923 meeting is 3/14 at 7PM, next LVHS meeting is 3/15 at 5:30 PM. We will email information to the GWCA distribution list re: how to call 311 and report grafitti, trash, vagrants, etc. Also, for cleanup, call grafitti busters. General experience has been that they promptly respond and thoroughly clean up the area.

LVHS - Per Steve Bines, the Lake View Council will have elections again in April. Steve will be running for office again and encourages all to vote and get involved in our neighborhood school.

Old business included:

Annual audit needs to be completed. Barb Sullivan and Kathy Scardina have reviewed the hardcopy directory for GWCA vs. the database. Barb will discuss the possibility of a GWCA directory at the June meeting along with the status for the GWCA member discount cards.

The Chicago Park District speaker was unable to attend however we will distribute information on Spring and Summer programs via the GWCA website distribution. Additional information will be made available at the neighborhood kiosks.

The meeting was adjouned at 8:45 PM.
