Warner Park Named One of Best Eight Places in the City to Read

Christopher Borelli wrote the following about Warner Park in the April 3, 2008 edition of the *Chicago Tribune*:

"The first thing to know about this patch of winding community garden is that you are welcome. Still ... at first it's not hard feeling like an intruder in a private yard, so intimate are the surroundings. What we have here is a garden and gazebo, a handful of slatted benches and stone seats in the middle of a residential block, sandwiched between a pair of old homes off Clark Street, as suburban a strip of real estate as you'll find in Chicago. But it is public. And cozy. Lois Buenger made sure of it. A neighborhood resident, she died five years ago, but not before buying the lot (and saving its beloved ginkgo tree) from developers. She took a second mortgage on her home to pay the \$72,000, said Margaret Weiner, program director for NeighborSpace, a non-profit that maintains green spots around the city. Fifteen years later, her health failing, Buenger sold the property (now valued at \$1 million) to NeighborSpace for \$600,000. The outcome: an urban oasis (with a few helpful electrical outlets, for laptops)."

PETITION CIRCULATED TO PAVE GREENVIEW ALLEY

The petition for rebuilding and paving the alley bounded by Greenview, Montrose, Cullom and Ashland was submitted to Alderman Schulter's office in January 2008. Approximately 62% of the owners, whose property fronts said streets, signed the petition which suffices the 51 percent requirement. As proposed, upon submission the alley will be surveyed by field engineers, designed and property owners will be called to a public hearing. Prior to the hearing taxpayers will be notified by mail to the time and location.

If there are any objections to the alley being paved, the objectors are given a legal protest petition. Thirty days are allowed from the date of the public hearing to circulate the protest petition and submit it to the Board of Local Improvements. Over 51 percent of residents must sign the petition to successfully protest the alley paving.

Assuming all proceeds as planned, it should take approximately two years from the date the petition is received to rebuild the alley. For a copy of the full petition, with signatures, please contact Terry Baublis at 281-2958 or motordc@aol.com and reference alley petition.
